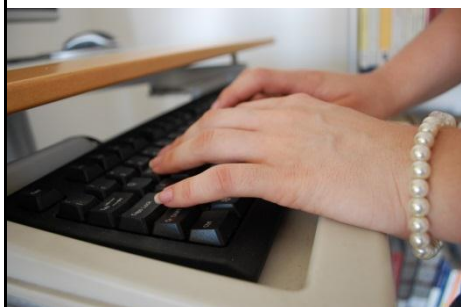

Engaging communities through ICT



Learning Services is a team within the Adult Learning & Skills Service of Cambridgeshire County Council. As a Service they specialise in delivering learning to individuals, often in small isolated rural communities and have developed new and innovative ways of engaging learners. One of their key aims is to ensure communities have access and support to participate in the digital society.

Community Access Points (CAPs)

Community Access Points were set up in Cambridgeshire in 2001 to give rural communities access to the internet and training in online skills. The CAPs were established in community owned buildings or businesses which allowed the public to use the technology provider.

CITILAB



Citilab is an experimental centre for the active dissemination of technology to citizens; one of the strength of Citilab is to create a real environment where citizens experiment and collaborate on common projects, sharing what they do and do not know jointly.
