Objectives of EU 2020 strategy


Objectives of the EU White Book to reduce GHG emissions by 60%:

- Halve the use of 'conventionally-fuelled' cars in urban transport by 2030 (phase them out in cities by 2050)
- By 2050, move close to zero fatalities in road transport
- Cycling (and pedestrian) traffic must be integrated in urban mobility plans



- Ensure conditions for mobility
- Facilitate sustainability
- Support environmental friendly transport modes
- Ensure conditions for safe transport







National Cycling Concept and Network Plan

- Status quo
- Conceptional goals (transportation, social)
- Management tools (financing, awareness, institution, regulation, information system)
- Development tools (network development, intermodality, parking and storage, services)
